

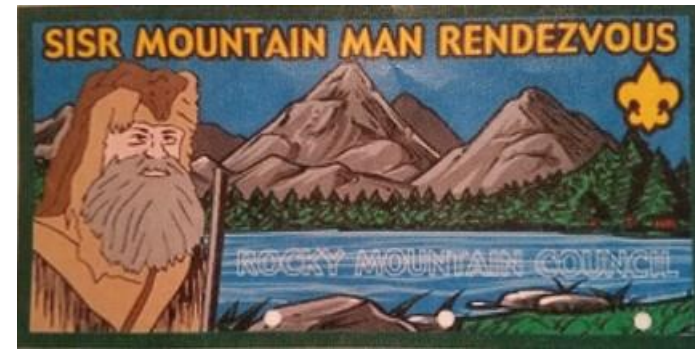
# SISR MOUNTAIN MAN RENDEZVOUS 2019

- Gather up your gear and head to the 5th Annual Fort SISR Rendezvous on September 27 to the 29th, 2019 at San Isabel Scout Ranch, San Isabel, Colorado. The Rendezvous is a mountain man rendezvous in celebration of the Fur Trade Rendezvous Era that occurred in the Rocky Mountains between 1825-1840 to include the Pioneer Era up to 1880. It is one of the best Rocky Mountain Council events of the year. This Mountain Man Rendezvous is an experience your family will be sure to remember for years. Come and experience historic living, Mountain Man Survival skills, games, archery, and events like Black Powder shooting.
- The Mountain Man Rendezvous was a historic event when Mountain Men would get together, trade, tell tall tales, and build life-time friendships. The Rendezvous set the conditions for westward expansion, increased knowledge of the continent, and increased understanding of Native American customs and traditions. We will celebrate the history and traditions of the west including Native Americans with the help of the Order of the Arrow. We will celebrate the pioneers, settlers, the US army, and traveling and living in the West up to 1880.

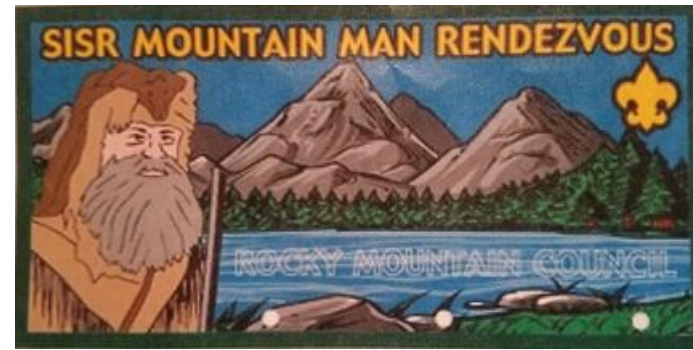
